

## 2024 Swing States and Races

### Presidential Swing States

- Arizona – tossup. Biden won by 10,000 votes .4% - that's 4 tenths of 1 % 22 election very close
- North Carolina – leans R. – Trump won by 74,000 votes 1.3%
- Georgia – tossup. Biden won by 11,000 votes .3 tenths of 1%
- Wisconsin – tossup – Biden won by 20,000 votes .6 % 6 tenths of 1%- trending stronger D
- Michigan – likely D -Biden won by 155,000 2.8 %- trending stronger D
- Pennsylvania – likely D – Biden won by 81,000 votes 1.2% trending stronger D
- Nevada – likely D -Biden won by 33,000 votes 2.4% elected R as Governor

### Senate

D's have 23 seats up this year. R's are defending only 11. Currently there are 48 D's and 3 Independents who caucus with D's. There are 49 R's. West Virginia is gone. Best we can hope for is 50/50 tie with VP casting deciding vote. That means we need to hold all three toss up seats as well as all lean D seats. Some people think we have a chance in Texas and Florida (I would be delighted but do not think so.)

### House

Currently 212 Democrats, 222 Republicans although now that is down to 3 because of NY 3 (special election in February) and 2 resignations, but those are in safe R districts. We need a net pick-up of 5 seats. There are 5 potential flips in both CA and NY each. But there are more key races. In some cases there are D seats. In some cases there are D seats to be defended. Some of each are in swing presidential states – 2 in AZ, 2 plus one open seat in Michigan. 4 seats to defend in NC. 2 to defend in PA. Here is the full list of seats, both flappable and ones we need to defend.

### Key House Races

The current House breakdown is 212 Democrats vs 222 Republicans (with one vacancy). Competitive seats exist all over the country, many in states which won't be central in the presidential race. Those states will need extra attention: California, New York, Ohio, New Jersey, Colorado, and Washington to name a few.
