Current Makeup

48 Democrats + 3 Independents who caucus with the Democrats = 51

49 GOP

Races

There are 23 Democratic seats and only 11 GOP seats up for election

Democratic Seats - 23

- Safe: 14 (incl Menendez)
- Likely: MD Alsobrooks
- Lean D: AZ Open Gallego, PA Casey, WI Baldwin
- Tossup: MI Open (Slotkin), MT (Tester), NV (Rosen), OH Sherrod Brown
- Solid R – West VA replacement for Mansion

If the Dems win all their seats, they will have a majority by 1. Otherwise, it is a tie and votes along partisan lines will be decided by the VP

GOP Seats - 11

All Likely R or Solid R. This means that the GOP can expect to hold all their current seats, i.e., 49. If Kamala wins, we have a VP to break ties.

Executive Summary

Because Mansion is not running in West VA leaving an open seat in a solid red state, the best that the Dems can do is hold 22 seats. This will result in a tie in partisan line votes, which will result in a decision by the VP. After 2024, be alert for special elections in the Senate!
